During the Legislative session:

How do I do this?

Outside of the legislative session

- Keep building up the relationship
- Find creative ways to educate
- Send emails, letters, thank you cards
- Attend town halls, other meetings posted on your legislators website
- Write an op-ed and get it published

What does it means to be a WA-SEN student?

- ► Broadly:
 - ► Tell legislators your story
 - Recruit other students to do the same
